Other birds spotted so far in February include Cedar Waxwings, European Starlings, Orange Crowned Warblers, Goldfinches, Ruby-crowned Kinglets and several varieties of woodpeckers! More than 150 species of birds have been seen in the park and in adjacent neighborhoods. The latest sightings can be found on the Great Hills Park page at ebird.org. Great Hills Park is an "on-leash only" park

Remember that all dogs in the park must remain on-leash at all times. This is for the safety of all park users as well as the safety of the dogs. APD officers can issue tickets that can cost hundreds of dollars.

Pocket Trail Maps

Pocket trail maps are available for a \$1 donation to the Playground Project. Maps show all trail markers and mileage, along with neighboring streets and general park information.
